Only weapons classified by their vendor or manufacturer as a knife or dagger are permitted. Short swords and any bladed weapons outside this classification are strictly disallowed to ensure fairness and adherence to tournament rules.

The event serves as both a competitive showcase and a ceremonial close to the day's activities, drawing spectators and participants alike to witness controlled, skill-based combat within a supervised environment under House Exchange oversight.
